

## Public Comment – Bruce Hagen:

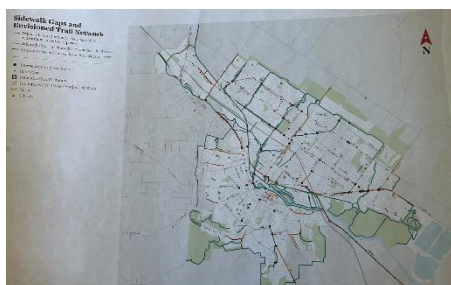
Bjorn and Adam (and Caitlin, to forward to PBAC members)

I see that Ad Hocs are on the [agenda for tonight's meeting](#). As you may know, SSP has been helping with the wayfinding effort, in advance of the official version. This has been in response to popular demand (among bike shops, the Visitor Center, our core members and aspiring bicyclists, including school kids.) If the Commission has or will have a wayfinding Ad Hoc, I'd like to be a public member.

## Map

I notice that the City Website uses the old [Green Lane map](#) for its current Bike/Ped Routes map. I created this map about 15 years ago (hand-annotated a City GIS base map using MS Word), and I'm thinking about producing an updated and super-simple easy-read commented version curated for today's traveller. I know we'll be getting official version (next year?), but I'm willing to put in some time to have one until then, at least for SSP use. It could also be a prototype for the official version. It would show only the routes that presently exist, including SMART, Lynch, Rainier, Park2Park (with D Street's new bike lanes), as well as calm on-street routes like Maria, 5th, St. Francis, etc. [Google's bike route view](#), along with the City's record of existing routes, is a good starting place for the curation process.

**Can you produce a PDF and a few large print of the City's base map that I could work with?** I've attached my photo of the big print of one of the ATP maps that had a good resolution, base detail (major street names, parks, schools. I don't want all the bus stops, intersection improvements, or any other proposed work. I don't want lot lines, but like the pale gray of the minor streets.) I'm doing a bike-to-school training for a dozen cub scouts next Monday, and would love to have the prints before then.



## Signs

We have made and installed roughly 35 of these signs (see photo) pointing out the SMART Pathway and Lynch Creek Trails. These are the two routes we hear most questions about. We have a [list](#) and [map](#) of these locations; we used them to plan and track installation, and will use them again for eventual maintenance and removal (they are somewhat waterproof and could last until the official version. We'll keep an eye on them.)



## Map Kiosks

The Petaluma High construction tech class built and helped install half dozen of these at trailheads in the late aughts, to hold the Green Lane Maps (these are well on their way to looking like relics of the Second Age of Middle Earth!) I have a list of the existing and proposed installations. SSP can help PBAC identify locations for something similar, to be part of the eventual wayfinding system.
