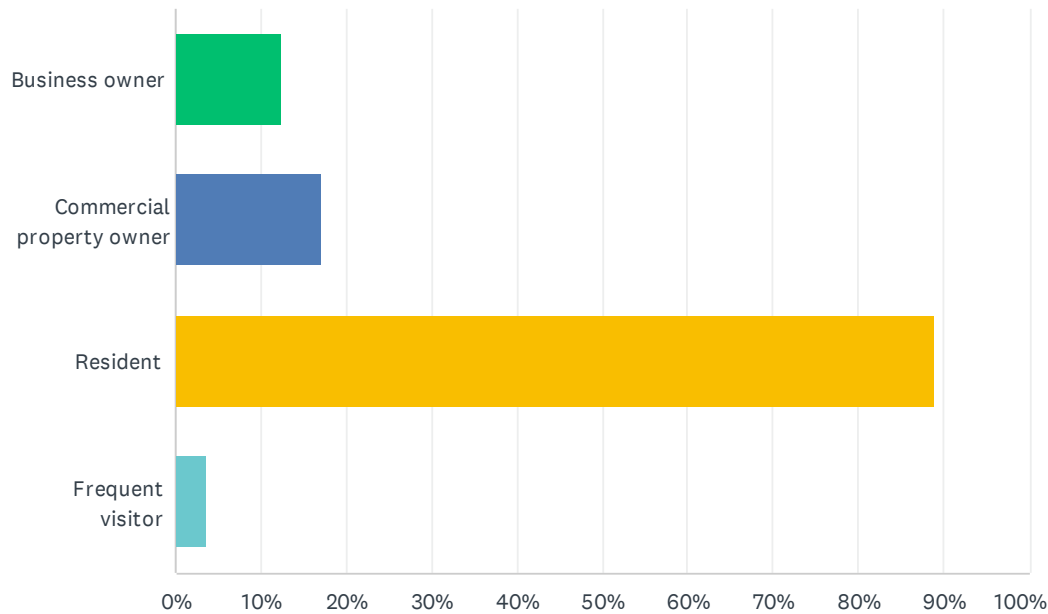


Q1 How do you identify with Petaluma?

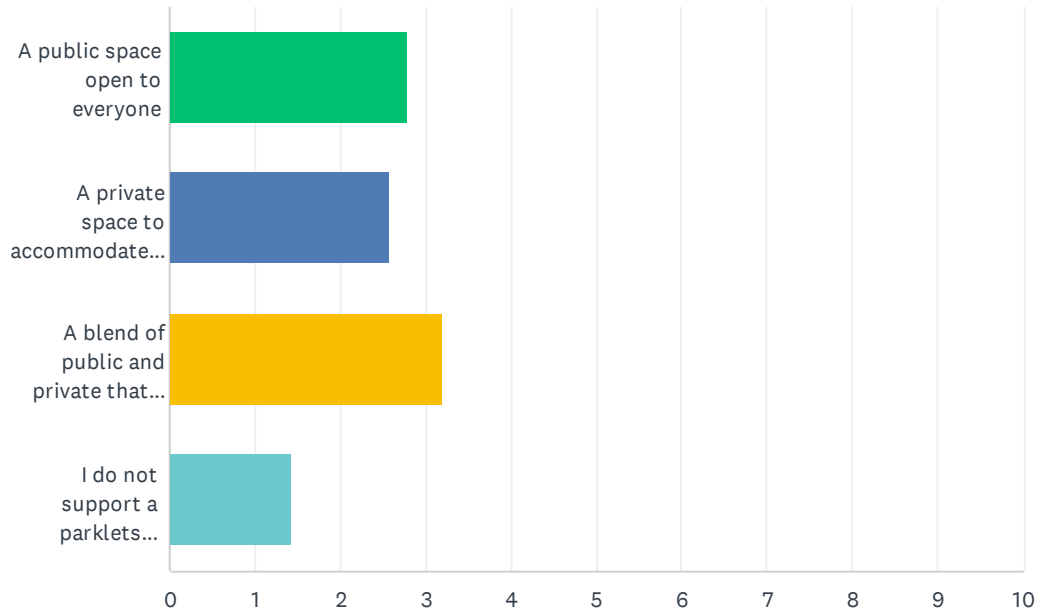

## Q2 In order of preference, what type of parklet would you want to see downtown? (Rank in order from most want to see to least want to see)

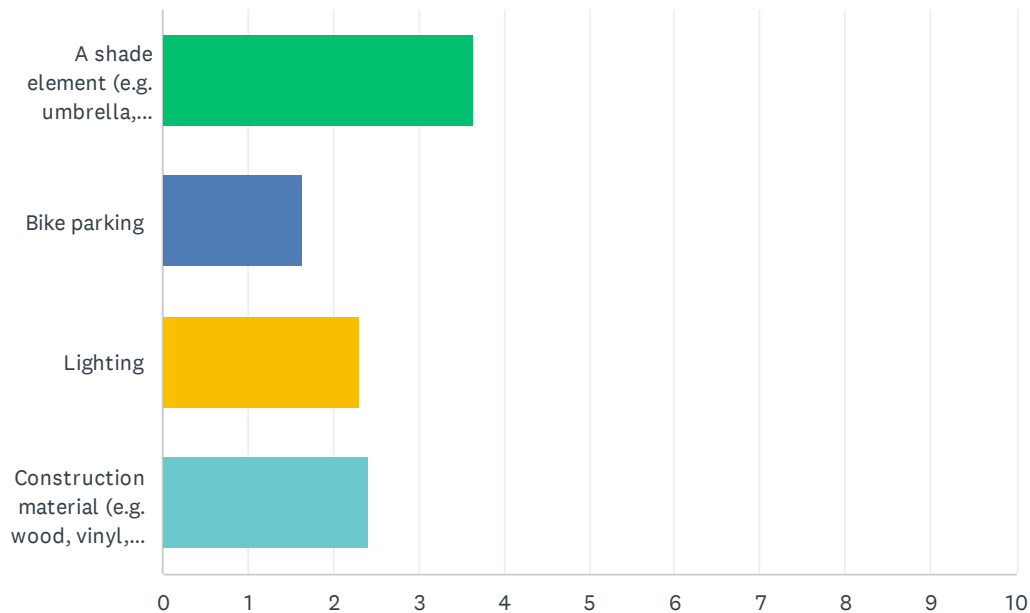

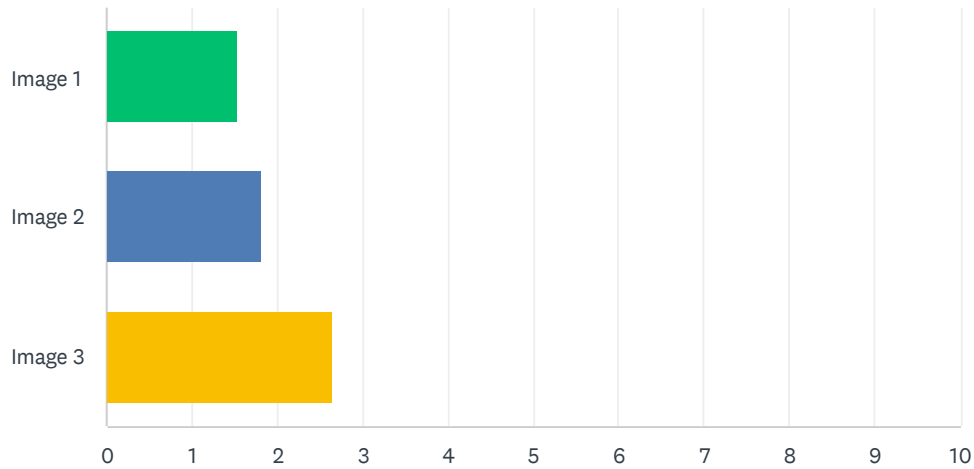

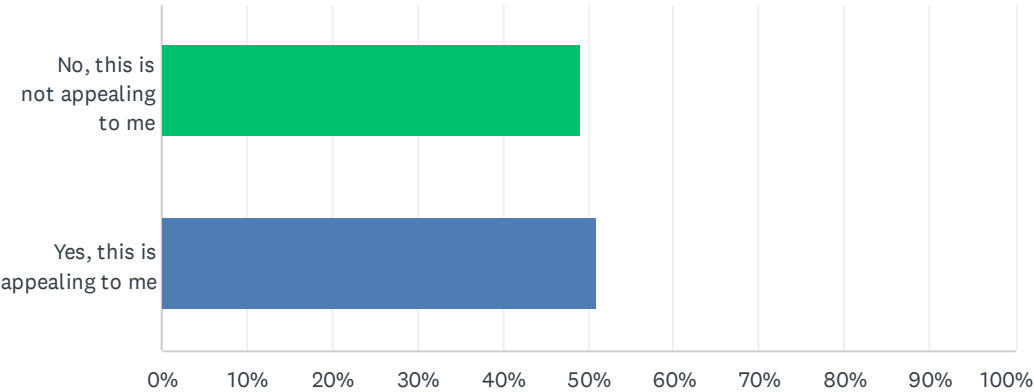

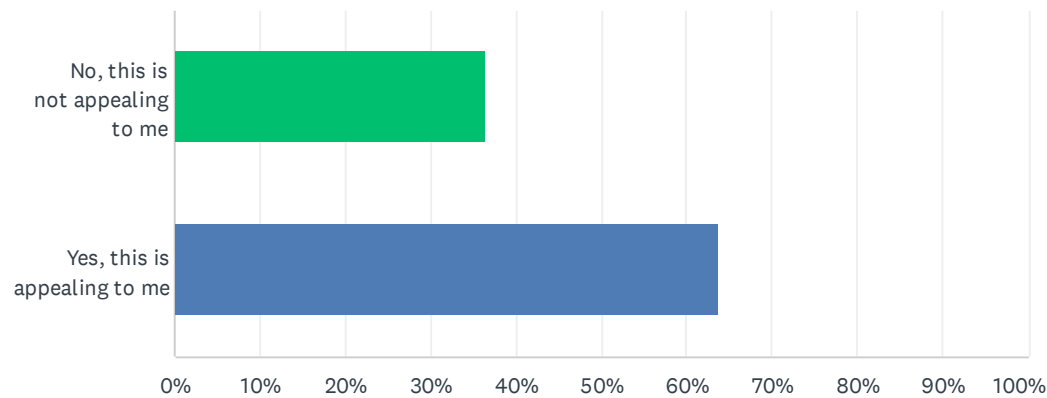

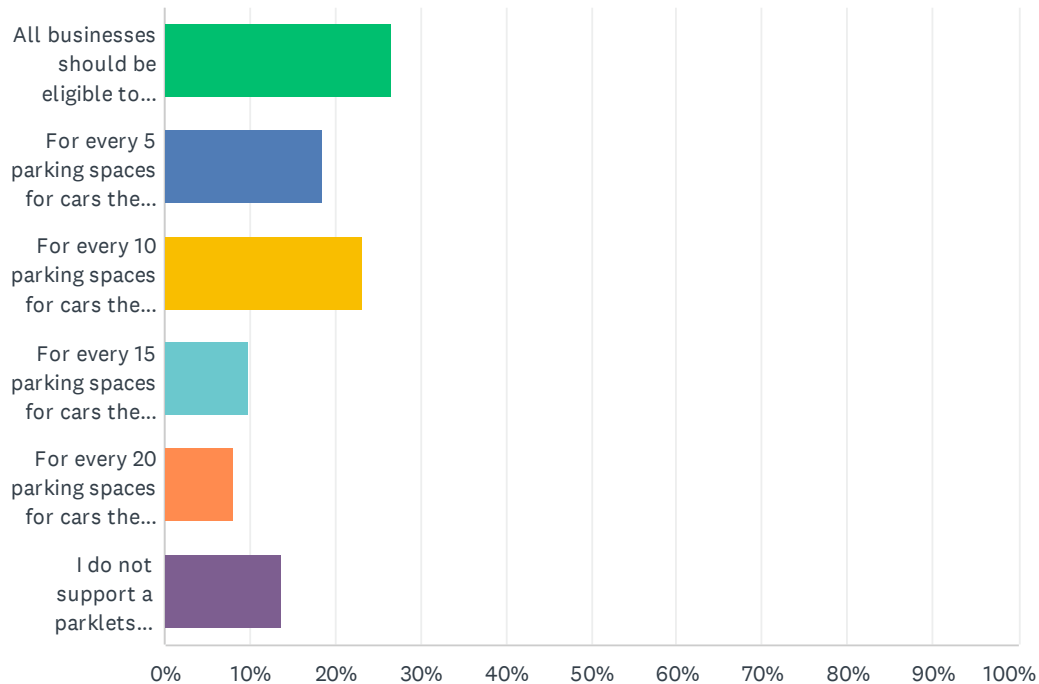

Q7 A typical parklet takes up two parking spaces. We want to know how many parklets you want to see allowed on one city block. Which statement do you agree with most?

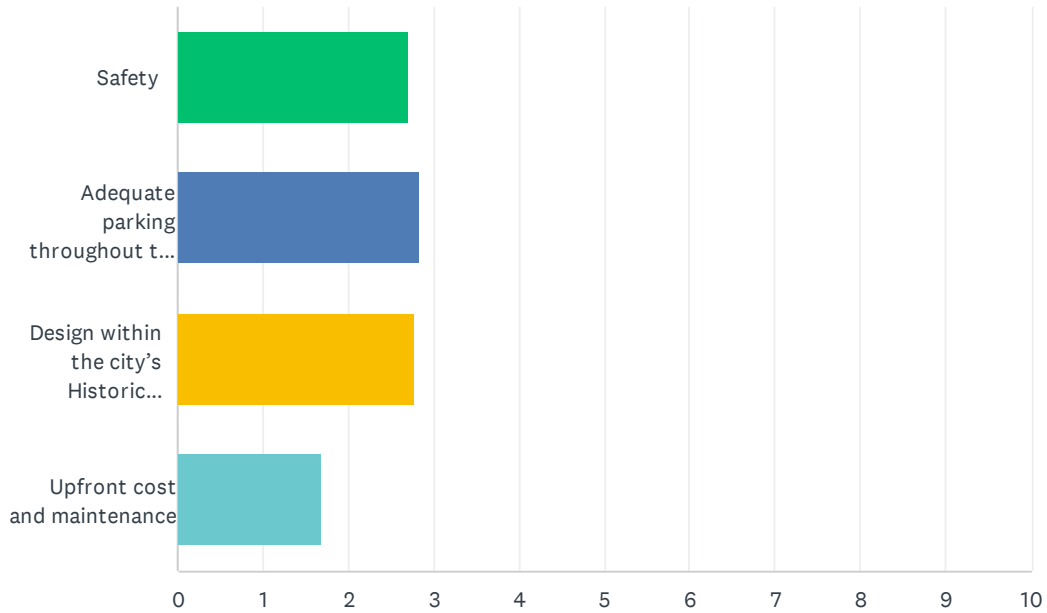

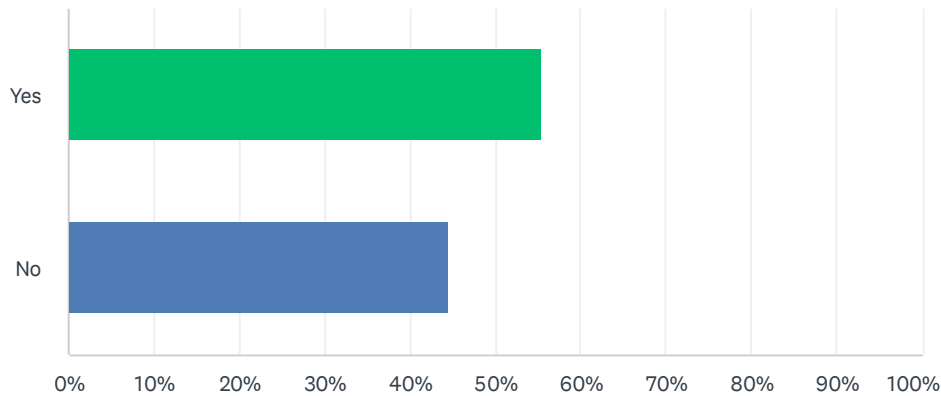

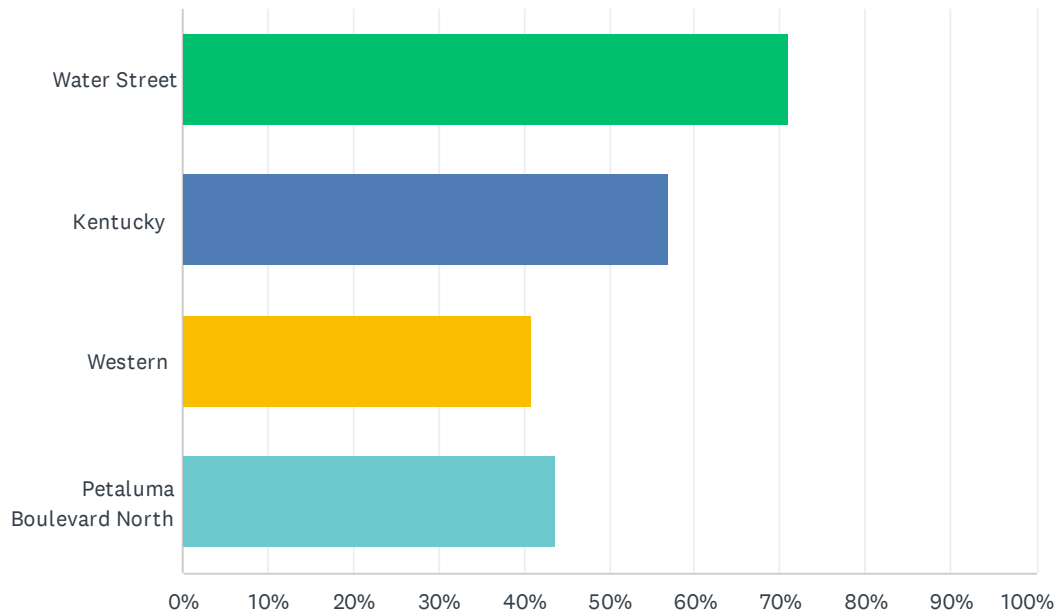
