## PUBLIC HEARINGS AND MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

8. Adoption (Second Reading) of Ordinance No. 2848 N.C.S. Amending Chapter 6.60 Entitled "Residential Tenancy Protections" of the Petaluma Municipal Code and Finding This Item is Exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15387(b)(5)

Mayor McDonnell announced he would recuse and left the Council Chamber.

City Attorney Eric Danly presented the staff report. Councilmembers asked questions of staff. Vice Mayor Cader Thompson opened public comment. Clayton Engstrom Michael Titone Morgan Margulies Diana Kingsbury Blake Hooper Maddy Hirshfield Sunny Noh Margaret DeMatteo Joel Esaia Gonzalez Angelina Soldatos Caroline Noa Vice Mayor Cader Thompson closed public comment.

City Attorney Eric Danly provided clarifications, as follows:

With respect to Section 6.60.030(B)(2), the proposed ordinance includes the language "This property is not subject to the <u>rent limits in Section 1947.12 of the Civil Code</u>, and is not subject to the just cause requirements of Section 1946.2 of the Civil Code." The underlined text should not have been included and should be removed as a drafting error because it applies generally to single family units whereas the City's regulations are more protective and exempt owners that own two or fewer units. For this reason, this language should not be included in the notice.

With respect to Section 6.60.080, the City heard concerns expressed about the language in the provision which define the relocation assistance obligation that landlords have concerning no-fault terminations of tenancies. The request was for the provision to refer to the relocation assistance that is owed to the "tenant household" and not to the "tenant." I don't recommend that change because, as "tenant" is defined in the City's regulations and Section 6.60.020(T), it means "a person entitled by written or oral agreement to the use or occupancy of a dwelling unit in the city." So, it means the party on the lease. The tenant household could be larger than that and I would have concerns about creating rights to relocation assistance to non-parties to the lease. I think that would create other kinds of problems that would be of concern to landlords. I think it is clear from the relocation assistance that it only obligates one payment per termination. We can also further clarify that in the pretty extensive information we provide about the regulations on the City's website.

The last thing I will mention is that we received a Councilmember comment with regard to Section 6.60.070 entitled "Additional notice requirements for no-fault terminations." The comment pointed out that Paragraph A which deals with terminating a tenancy due to permanent withdrawal of the unit from the rental market, and Paragraph C which deals with terminating tenancy due to intent to demolish or substantially remodel the unit, both require notice to be given to the tenant household and the City housing manager. The issue is that Paragraph B of that same section that pertains to terminating tenancy due to the intent of the owner or owner's relative to occupy the dwelling unit does not state the same noticing requirements. The Councilmember who brough this to our attention believed it to be an error in the drafting, which, if that is the Council's intent to have the same notice requirements for each of those types of no-fault terminations, then I would note too that we could reflect that change.

Councilmembers discussed the item.

Councilmember Healy requested City Attorney Eric Danly's clarifying comments regarding 6.60.080 be reflected verbatim in the minutes for the legislative history.
