I am writing on behalf of <u>350 Petaluma</u>. We strongly urge you to discontinue new installations of synthetic turf in Petaluma and to replace existing synthetic turf with solutions that work *with* nature, not against it.

We understand that the synthetic turf at Lucchesi Park needs replacement. Start here with a solution that considers the following:

## Synthetic turf:

- Contains plastic, a petrochemical product, and recycled tires or other untested materials
- Releases microplastics and toxic chemicals many that are known carcinogens into our soil, water, and air, putting children at greatest risk
- Requires ongoing maintenance costs for sanitation and disinfection
- Has a short "life," requiring regular replacement and increasing overall costs
- Is not recyclable and is therefore incinerated or landfilled at the end of its "life," contributing to our climate crisis and putting nearby communities at risk
- Creates heat island effects an increasing concern, given rising temperatures

This quote from Diana E. Conway, President of <u>Safe Healthy Playing Fields Inc</u>. sums it up: "I like to compare synthetic turf to a bad relationship. . . . It gets dangerously hot, it's toxic to everyone around me, it's unsustainable. . . and it's really hard to get rid of."
