- Recommends more education around density
- Look at opportunities for zoning changes; (IZO) Implementing Zoning Ordinance

Committeemember Feedback:

- Recommended to post on social media sites, i.e., Facebook, Nextdoor
- Important to keep applicants informed of status/next steps and post relevant information as necessary
- Consideration of adding bonus points, i.e., climate mitigation
- Noted possible neighbor conflicts with changes; recommended small steps
- Add family resource centers, transit stops, mobile home parks to the list
- Put toolkit out there often
- Explain “terms” in application when needed
- Recommends more open text fields in application for opportunities to “tell their story”
- Ask applicant if they are willing to educate/reach out to neighbor(s)
- Factor in other criteria, i.e., population, traffic
- Give opportunities to plant trees
